

# **Recipient Data Insights - Do Not Pay**

The Recipient Data Insights (RDI) Dashboard screen's Compliance card section for Do Not Pay has been updated with two new compliance indicators: the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List and the Excluded Foreign Entities list.

To accommodate the larger size for the Do Not Pay feature, the FAPIIS indicator has been moved below the SAM.gov compliance indicators.




Figure 1: Dashboard containing new Do Not Pay indicators

Please note: Based on the name, users often assume that "Do Not Pay" is a single indicator for whether or not a Recipient should receive funding, similar to the SAM.gov Excluded Parties indicator (or its predecessor EPLS). Do Not Pay (DNP) is a repository of various data sources. The Department of Treasury collects and shares data from various agencies for use in "preventing and detecting improper payments". Some of the data they maintain is already available in RDI (ex: SAM.gov registration, Federal Debt, FAPIIS, etc...) from a different source (ex: SAM.gov, FAPIIS). The two DNP indicators added with this release provide new compliance information for organizations.



#### IRS TAX EXEMPT REVOCATION LIST

Partners Impacted: All Activation Required: No

**User Type(s)/Role(s) Impacted: Grantors** 

Nonprofit organizations can apply for IRS Tax Exemption. However, if they fail to submit their IRS 900 forms for 3 years in a row, the tax exempt status will be revoked and the organization is added to the Department of Treasury's Automatic Revocation of Exemption List. For simplicity the list is called the "IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List".

When a GrantSolutions user searches RDI for an organization, RDI sends a request to Do Not Pay to determine if the organization is included on the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List. Since RDI is checking DNP in real-time, the Last Update date will always be today.



# Scenario 1: Nonprofit Organization's Tax Exempt Status has been Revoked

If a nonprofit organization has previously had a Tax Exemption that was revoked and not reinstated, then the system will show the following:

- A yellow warning indicator
- The status "On IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List"
- The date the Tax Exempt Status was revoked
- A "View More Info" link that opens a modal containing the text "IRS Tax Exemption Revoked due to failure to submit 990s for three consecutive years."

As with the previous compliance indicators, if the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List flag is yellow then the Compliance indicator in the hero and at the top of the Compliance card will be yellow as well.




Figure 2: Nonprofit Organization on the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List



### Scenario 2: Nonprofit Organization's Tax Exempt Status has been Reinstated

If a nonprofit organization has previously had their Tax Exemption revoked but it has since been reinstated, then the system will show the following:

- A green indicator
- The status "Reinstated on IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List"
- The date the Tax Exempt Status was reinstated
- A "View More Info" link that opens a modal containing the Reinstatement Date and Revocation Date

As with the previous compliance indicators, if the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List flag and all other indicators are green, the Compliance indicator in the hero and at the top of the Compliance card will be green.




Figure 3: Nonprofit Organization Reinstated from the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List



# Scenario 3: Nonprofit Organization's Tax Exempt Status has never been Revoked

If a nonprofit organization has never had their Tax Exemption revoked, then the system will show the following:

- A green indicator
- The status "Not Included on IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List"

As with the previous compliance indicators, if the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List flag and all other indicators are green, the Compliance indicator in the hero and at the top of the Compliance card will be green.




Figure 4: Nonprofit Organization not on the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List



### Scenario 4: Not a Nonprofit Organization

If an organization is not a Nonprofit, then the Tax Exemption does not apply and the system will show the following:

- A green indicator
- The status "Not Applicable for IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List"

As with the previous compliance indicators, if the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List flag and all other indicators are green, the Compliance indicator in the hero and at the top of the Compliance card will be green.




Figure 5: Not a Nonprofit Organization so not on the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List



# Scenario 5: Connection to Do Not Pay is Down

If DNP does not provide a response to GrantSolutions, then the system will show the following:

- A gray indicator
- The status "Site Unavailable Try again later"

If DNP does not provide a response, this field will have a gray indicator and a "Site Unavailable – Try again later" status.




Figure 6: No response from the Do Not Pay IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List



#### **EXCLUDED FOREIGN ENTITIES**

Partners Impacted: All Activation Required: No

User Type(s)/Role(s) Impacted: Grantors

The Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) within the Department of Treasury maintains an Excluded Foreign Entities list. Do Not Pay says this "Contains a list of individuals and companies owned or controlled by, or acting for or on behalf of, targeted countries. It also lists individuals, groups, and entities, such as terrorists and narcotics traffickers designated under programs that are not country specific; collectively, such individuals and companies are called "Specially Designated Nationals" or "SDNs"; their assets are blocked, and U.S. persons are generally prohibited from doing business with them".

When a GrantSolutions user searches RDI for an organization, RDI send a request to Do Not Pay to determine if the organization is included on the OFAC's Excluded Foreign Entities list. Since RDI is checking DNP in real-time, the Last Update date will always be today.

### Scenario 1: On the OFAC's Excluded Foreign Entities list

If an organization is on the OFAC's Excluded Foreign Entities list, then the system will show the following:

- A yellow warning indicator
- The status "On the Excluded Foreign Entities list"
- A "View More Info" link that opens a modal containing the text "This organization appears on the Specially Designated Nationals List and is prohibited from entering into financial transactions with U.S. Government."

As with the previous compliance indicators, if the Excluded Foreign Entities List flag is yellow then the Compliance indicator in the hero and at the top of the Compliance card will be yellow as well.



### Scenario 2: Not on the OFAC's Excluded Foreign Entities list

If an organization is not on the OFAC's Excluded Foreign Entities list, then the system will show the following:

- A green indicator
- The status "Not on the Excluded Foreign Entities list"

As with the previous compliance indicators, if the OFAC's Excluded Foreign Entitites flag and all other indicators are green, the Compliance indicator in the hero and at the top of the Compliance card will be green.




Figure 7: Not a Nonprofit Organization so not on the IRS Tax Exempt Revocation List



# Scenario 3: Connection to Do Not Pay is Down

If DNP does not provide a response, then the system will show the following:

- A gray indicator
- The status "Site Unavailable Try again later"




Figure 8: Could not connect to the Do Not Pay Excluded Foreign Entities list
